

A new approach in treatment of unilateral missing upper lateral incisors.

An anterior Tooth Size discrepancy is a very frequently overlooked deviation in teeth within dentistry. While studies show that 20-30% of the population have a significant anterior TSD. The lateral upper incisors in particular are often too narrow and this can lead to periodontal complications in the lower jaw. The gold standard ratio between the central incisor and the lateral incisor is 1: 0,618.

Patients with unilateral agenesis of a lateral upper incisor, the lateral incisor that is still present is often reduced. So there is a Tooth Size Discrepancy!

This Tooth Size Discrepancy offers a wonderful solution to achieve a neutro-occlusion on the canines with natural elements.
